
Seeks Smoother Performance, Less Volatility

Total returns are calculated assuming purchase of a share at the market price or NAV on the first day and sale of a share at the market price or NAV on the last day of each period reported. The Total Returns Based on NAV and Market Price do not reflect brokerage commissions in connection with the purchase or sale of Fund shares, which if included would lower the performance shown above. The NAV used in the Total Return calculation assumes all management fees and operating expenses incurred by the Fund. Market Price returns are based upon the midpoint of the last trade as of 4:00pm EST and do not reflect the returns you would received if you traded shares at other times. The first day of secondary market trading is typically several days after the fund inception of investment operations date; therefore, the NAV of the Fund is used as a proxy for the period from inception of investment operations to the first day of secondary market trading to calculate the Market Price returns.

Volatility refers to the annualized standard deviation of returns. #The Index Volatility is for the Bloomberg Barclays High Yield Very Liquid Index.

Under the management fee for GHYB, Goldman Sachs Asset Management LP., the Fund's investment adviser, is responsible for paying substantially all the expenses of the Fund, excluding the payments under the Fund's 12b-1 plan (if any), interest expenses, taxes, acquired fund fees and expenses, brokerage fees, costs of holding shareholder meetings, litigation, indemnification and extraordinary expenses.

Net Asset Value is the market value of one share of the Fund. This amount is derived by dividing the total value of all the securities in the fund's portfolio, less any liabilities, by the number of fund shares outstanding. Market Price is the price at which the Fund's shares are trading on the NYSE Arca. The Market Price of the Fund's shares will fluctuate and, at the time of sale, shares may be worth more or less than the original investment or the Fund's then current net asset value. The Fund cannot predict whether its shares will trade at, above or below net asset value. Fund holdings and allocations shown are unaudited, and may not be representative of current or future investments. Fund holdings and allocations may not include the Fund's entire investment portfolio, which may change at any time. Leverage ratio is a measure of debt relative to total value, and may be a measure of a company's financial health.

The method of calculation of the **30-Day Standardized Yield** is mandated by the Securities and Exchange Commission and is determined by dividing the net investment income per share earned during the last 30 days of the period by the maximum public offering price ("POP") per share on the last day of the period. This number is then annualized. The yield figure reflects the dividends and interest earned during the 30 day period, after the deduction of the fund's expenses.

ETF Fund shares are not individually redeemable and are issued and redeemed by the Fund at their net asset value ("NAV") only in large, specified blocks of shares called creation units. Shares otherwise can be bought and sold only through exchange trading at market price (not NAV). Shares may trade at a premium or discount to their NAV in the secondary market. Ordinary broker commissions may apply. Brokerage commissions will reduce returns.

Index Methodology

To construct the Index, the Index provider defines a Liquid Universe of bonds with a minimum of \$400 million outstanding and maximum 15 years to maturity and issuers with a minimum of \$1,000 million outstanding, within the FTSE US High-Yield Market Index.

Issuers within the Liquid Universe are then ranked, within broad industry groups, by their change in debt service and leverage. Those issuers with the most deterioration in debt service and leverage are excluded from the Index. Issuers that pass the fundamental screen in addition to any private issuers who pass the liquidity screen are included to form the Index.

The Index is rebalanced monthly to consider changes to the Liquid Universe and quarterly to consider changes to the fundamental screen. The Index is owned by FTSE Russell and developed with concepts from GSAM.

The premium/discount is calculated using the last traded price from the primary exchange on which the Fund is listed. This differs from the market price, which shows the closing price from the exchange on which the Fund was last traded.

The Goldman Sachs Access High Yield Corporate Bond ETF (the "Fund") seeks to provide investment results that closely correspond, before fees and expenses, to the performance of the FTSE Goldman Sachs High Yield Corporate Bond Index (the "Index"), which is designed to measure the performance of high yield corporate bonds denominated in U.S. dollars that meet certain liquidity and fundamental screening criteria. The Fund's investments are subject to the risks associated with debt securities generally, including **credit, liquidity, interest rate, call and extension risk. Investment terms: Duration is the method of determining a bond's price sensitivity given a change in interest rates. **Weighted Average Yield to Maturity** is the averaged total return anticipated on a group of bonds, if held to the end of their lifetime. **Cash** may include local currency, foreign currency, short-term investment funds, bank acceptances, commercial paper, margin, repurchase agreements, time deposits, variable-rate demand notes, and/or money market mutual funds. This method may differ from the method independently used by benchmark providers. GSAM will use a single rating if that is the only one available. Securities that are not rated by all three agencies are reflected as such in the breakdown. Unrated securities may be purchased by a Fund if they are determined by the Investment Adviser to be of a credit quality consistent with the Fund's credit rating requirements. Unrated securities do not necessarily indicate low quality, and for such securities the investment adviser will evaluate the credit quality. GSAM converts all ratings to the equivalent S&P major rating category when illustrating credit rating breakdowns. Ratings and fund/benchmark credit quality may change over time.


